# 1. Background and Justification

Mauritania is currently facing a **complex, multi-hazard humanitarian and public health crisis**, marked by:

- Three concurrent epidemics:
  - o Diphtheria
  - o Rift Valley Fever
  - Dengue
- A rapidly worsening refugee situation, with over 300,000 refugees from Mali hosted primarily in Hodh El Chargui and continued influx expected.

The crisis is most acute in **Bassikounou/Mbera camp area**, but impacts are **national**, requiring consistent multi-level technical support and coordination.

Mental health and psychosocial needs are substantial among refugees, host communities, children and women, frontline workers, and families affected by epidemics and displacement. Current MHPSS capacity in-country is limited and fragmented across institutions and partners.

Existing WHO staff are fully engaged in outbreak response and essential emergency duties, with **no surge capacity available** to lead structured MHPSS coordination, assessment, and systembuilding.

To ensure a **coherent, IASC-aligned national MHPSS response**, a dedicated expert is urgently required to:

- Lead a national interagency MHPSS situation analysis
- Conduct MHPSS needs assessments and service mapping
- Establish referral pathways and coordination mechanisms
- Strengthen national and decentralized response capacities
- Bridge humanitarian and health-system strengthening efforts

This deployment is essential to avoid fragmentation, delays, and inadequate coverage of vulnerable populations.

### 2. Purpose of the Position

To provide **technical leadership**, **coordination and operational support** to the Government and partners to strengthen MHPSS preparedness and response in Mauritania, through

comprehensive MHPSS needs assessment, mapping, and inter-agency coordination in line with **IASC MHPSS guidance** and **WHO standards**.

The expert will support the **entire country**, while being **physically based in Bassikounou** to ensure proximity to the most affected populations.

# 3. Key Responsibilities

## **Technical leadership & assessments**

- Lead an inter-agency MHPSS situation analysis at national and field levels
- Conduct MHPSS needs assessments and service/resource mapping
- Identify gaps, vulnerabilities, and priority interventions
- Develop/strengthen MHPSS referral pathways and protocols
- Support integration of MHPSS into health and other sectors emergency operations

# **Coordination & liaison**

- Support the Ministry of Health and partners in establishing or strengthening an **MHPSS Technical Working Group**
- Coordinate with **UN agencies**, **NGOs**, **Red Cross Movement**, **civil society**, **and community structures**
- Ensure alignment with IASC MHPSS guidance and global emergency frameworks
- Facilitate **government-UN-partners interface** for MHPSS interventions

## **Capacity strengthening**

- **Provide technical support and mentorship** to national and subnational teams and partners from various sectors
- Adapt training material and orientation sessions on MHPSS in emergencies, referral systems, and psychological first aid (PFA)
- Train health and community workers to improve detection, management, and referral of priority mental health conditions
- Support and contribute to the functioning, supervision, and quality assurance of community-based listening and psychosocial support areas, ensuring safe, confidential, and culturally appropriate services
- Promote community engagement and participation in MHPSS activities, including awareness campaigns, peer-support initiatives, and culturally appropriate outreach

## Reporting & knowledge management

- Produce regular situation reports, assessment briefs, and recommendations
- Contribute to resource mobilization and donor updates
- Prepare a final mission report with roadmap and priority actions

#### **Essential Qualifications:**

• Advanced university degree in psychology, psychiatry, social work, mental health, public health, or related field.

 Minimum 7 years professional experience in MHPSS in humanitarian/emergency contexts.
